

# Music Notes

### ELW 681 We Plow the Fields and Scatter (WIR PFLÜGEN)

This month we will celebrate God's creation with this hymn "We Plow the Fields and Scatter". It is based on Psalm 104 which tells us of how God made everything in creation — all plants, animals, humans, skies, the seasons, etc. — for us to enjoy and to nourish ourselves. It describes all aspects of our lives in creation and how everything is so intricately made to work together.

This hymn is written by Matthias Claudius (1740-1815), a German poet, as a portrayal of the idyllic life in country living. It was originally written with 13 stanzas and Jane M. Campbell (1817-1878) translated it from German to English with 3 verses and a thankful refrain. The poem was not originally written as a hymn, however it showed up in the *Evangelisches Gesangbuch* with Martin Luther's explanation of the fourth petition of the Lord's Prayer - God gives daily bread, even without our prayer, to all sinful people; but we ask in this prayer that God would help us to realize this and receive our daily bread with thanksgiving."

The tune name WIR PFLÜGEN is also known as CLAUDIUS and appeared in Johann A. P. Schulz's *Lieder in Volksten* a group of melodies for public schools. He is also famous for composing the children's Christmas hymn, "O Come, Little Children".

 We plow the fields and scatter the good seed on the land, But it is fed and watered by God's almighty hand, Who sends the snow in winter, the warmth to swell the grain, The breezes and the sunshine, and soft refreshing rain.

All good gifts around us are sent from heaven above, We thank you, Lord, we thank you, Lord, for all your love.

### Gather Summer 2021 Study: Just Love, Part 2

Welcome to the "Just Love Part 2: Just L.I.F.E. (Liberation Is For Everyone!)"

Gather Bible study by Angela Khabeb. This three-session summer Bible study series is inspired, in part, by Jesus' proclamations: "If the Son makes you free, you will be free indeed" (John 8:36) and "I came that they might have life, and have it abundantly" (John 10:10)

Session 1, "Just Wisdom," delves into how God can open our hearts and minds to a spiritual understanding that is not bound by our human comprehension. Just Wisdom comes to us through reverence for our awesome God. Our key verse for the first session informs us: "The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom" (Proverbs 9:10). Together we will consider our faithful response to Wisdom's invitation.

Session 2 explores "Just Truth." We will travel with Paul on the road to Damascus and experience his life-changing transformation. We will also take a closer look at how our Savior chose to share difficult truths with God's people, and we will witness his boldness in speaking truth to power.

Session 3, "Just Hope," looks at our role as the body of Christ. How are we called to be cocreators with God in transforming our communities into a more just society? Filled with resurrection hope, we'll look to the prophet Ezekiel and his miraculous encounter in the valley of dry bones, and we'll share how God's amazing activity continues to unfold in our own lives. Angela Khabeb is a pastor of Holy Trinity Lutheran Church in Minneapolis.

She has an amazing husband, Benhi, and three spectacular children, Konami, Khenna and Khonni. More information on this study will be available soon. In the meantime, check out Khabeb's presentation on "just love" from Women of the ELCA's "Just love: A virtual preview."

August means back to school for many of our area students, including those at Central Lakes
College. Food scarcity can be an issue for college students, some of whom may be single parents and/or may not have access to refrigeration or cooking facilities. To address this issue, the Brainerd and Staples campuses have Food Pantry facilities available on a daily basis. Students can drop in to pick up basic food items, most of which are provided through Second Harvest. There is also a need for specialty items that are often unavailable. We can help by collecting donations of these items, like:

- Spices: salt, pepper, cinnamon, garlic powder, Italian Seasoning & Taco Seasoning
- Shelf-stable microwavable meals & pasta/rice sides
- Canned veggies and fruit with tab tops
- Laundry detergent
- Deodorant, toothpaste & brushes, feminine hygiene products
- Diapers & baby food
- New/gently used hats and gloves




# Calling all Blood Donors and Volunteer Helpers!

# A Message from our ELCA Global Missionary

### Russian Correspondent

### O God, Our Help in Ages Past

Nina Dmitrieva, one of the key lay leaders of St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Vladivostok, thought of the words to this classical hymn when reflecting upon the arrival of their new pastor, Vitaly Mohr. They came to her during Vitaly's installation, as she heard the text for the day, Isaiah 55.8-9: "For my thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways, says the LORD. For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways and my thoughts than your thoughts." She thought of the congregation's surprising history. Founded in the late 19th century as a spiritual home for ethnic minorities



that found themselves living in the Far East, St. Paul's was closed (as were all Lutheran churches) by the early 1930s. Yet that was not the end; the next chapter started in 1992, when Pastor Manfred Brockmann arrived from Germany to help re-establish the congregation and to reclaim their beautiful home in the historical church building, which had been converted in the Soviet period into a Navy history museum.

As was the case with most Russian congregations, the 1990s was a time of vibrant rebirth and wave after wave of emigration, changing the character of the church from one that was focused on ethnic minorities to one that offered a special vision for Christian life; at St. Paul's, that vision has included a focus on an ecumenical openness, an intellectual cultural climate, and classical music.

Pastor Brockmann is almost two decades into his retirement by now, though, and it is important that the congregation have new leadership to move forward. Finding the right person to take the call took quite a long time. Nina points out that God was the congregation's help as it went through various struggles – "We love our church, we thank God that He preserved it through the times of godlessness, and helped to restore it." She is now confident that their church can "now bring in more and more people in need of spiritual nourishment, consolation and salvation."

Adapting to a new leader won't be easy, but Nina's attitude toward this change is summarized in her short prayer: "Give us wisdom to accept our new pastor with love and obedience, respect and help in his ministry for the spiritual growth of your church."



### **Making a Plastic Bottle Irrigator for Plants**

Making a plastic bottle irrigator is a pretty simple project. All you need is a plastic bottle, something to make small holes (such as a nail, ice pick, or small drill), and a sock or nylon (optional). You can use a 2-liter or 20-ounce soda bottle. The smaller bottles work better for container plants. Punch 10-15 small holes all over the bottom half of the plastic bottle, including the bottom of the bottle. You can then place the plastic bottle in the sock or nylon. This prevents soil and roots from getting into the bottle and clogging up the holes. The soda bottle irrigator is then planted in the garden or in a pot with its neck and lid opening above the soil level, next to a newly installed plant. Thoroughly water the soil around the plant, then fill the plastic bottle irrigator with water. Some people find it is easiest to use a funnel to fill plastic bottle irrigators. The plastic bottle cap can be used to



regulate the flow from the soda bottle irrigator. The tighter the cap is screwed on, the slower the water will seep out of the holes. To increase flow, partially unscrew the cap or remove it altogether. The cap also helps prevent mosquitoes from breeding in the plastic bottle and keeps soil out.

### WILL FAKE MEAT LOWER OUR CARBON FOOTPRINT AND SAVE EARTH'S CLIMATE?

Faux burgers produced by companies such as Impossible Foods and Beyond Meat, as well as the growing of meat from animal cells in vats, are touted as the solution to the huge carbon emissions of industrialized feedlots and CAFOs (confined animal feedlot operations). Yet the same industrial grains used to feed these animals are grown over many acres with pesticides, the intense use of fossil fuels for machinery and fertilizer, and then transported long distances to become a highly processed faux meat product.

According to a Minnesota-based Land Stewardship Project study, plant-based burgers are a concoction of industrialized grains highly processed in expensive, high-tech facilities. A key ingredient for flavor is often a molecule called "heme," which is produced in tanks of genetically modified yeast. It turns out that highly processed foods of all types have a massive carbon footprint, given the amount of energy and ingredients required. And in general, the more processed a food product is, the less healthy it is.

A Michigan State University study has also found that when cattle were raised in a managed rotational grazing system that allowed pasture grasses to develop deep roots, the soils could **sequester enough carbon** to compare favorably with the carbon footprint of the energy, tillage and chemicals used to produce the vast quantities of corn fed in feedlot systems and then processed into faux meats.

Regenerative agriculture seeks to grow food in a way that works with nature, and the plains that can no longer grow grain crops can be transformed into healthy grasslands with the help of grazing animals, whose dung and hooves pressing into the soil create beneficial microbial life underground. Enriched soil helps to solve climate change by absorbing and holding water, drawing down carbon out of the atmosphere and keeping it in the ground where it belongs.
