And when he had said these things, as they were looking on, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. And while they were gazing into heaven as he went, behold, two men stood by them in white robes, and said, "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking into heaven? This Jesus, who was taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven." Acts 1:9-11

I have been pondering this passage in my personal devotions. As the disciples are saying their final good byes to Jesus, they watch him ascend into heaven, and two men in robes appear standing next to them saying, "why are you standing and looking to heaven?"

During the last two years of the pandemic I have felt like I have been standing still with my eyes and ears glued to the tv, radio, newspaper, social media, and news outlets trying to gather as much information about Covid 19- variants, vaccines, treatments, etc. I will admit that this virus has me nervous at times. But I have also heard the voices of those saying "why are you standing here?"

In the midst of our nervousness, anxiety, and stress about what is going on in the world (protests, school shootings, uptick in crime, and our own patience with one another,) it seems that something is missing. That something is community; it's as though we have forgotten how to live with one another. We have been so careful about loving our neighbor from a distance that it seems that we have forgotten how to be brothers and sister in Christ together.

Our church theme for 2022 is "The Year of Invitation." In the spirit of this theme, I invite you to join us in worship - as nice as it is to watch worship online, we miss you. We miss your presence and your voice as we sing our praises to God. I would also ask that you extend an invitation to your friends, neighbors, and families - to join us in worship on Sunday and/or Wednesday. Come and join us in any and all of our activities that are happening at church. It is hard to be the body of Christ without you; we miss you and need your help.

Together, let's make 2022 "The Year of Invitation," the year that we come back together and worship our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.



Plan Now to Join Us January 12th at 10am in Chapel Hall for the first session of the Winter 2022 Gather Study "The Kingdom of God" by Rev. Mark Allan Powell

Rev. Powell is a New Testament Scholar and author of the world's best-selling New Testament textbook and editor of the *Harper-Collins Bible Dictionary*. As Winter 2022 Gather Study leader, he will help us understand the meaning of the phrase Kingdom of God". He will also share what may be some surprises with us. For example the phrase *"The kingdom of God"* refers to an activity, not a location—and it has nothing to do with God being a "king." Jesus probably talked more about the kingdom of God than anything else. In scriptures we hear Jesus talk about where it is found, when it will come, how it draws near, to whom it belongs.

At the Winter 2022 Gather Studies we'll learn a lot about "the kingdom of God".

January 12th: We will ask, what would it mean for God to be in charge of our lives? And why would that be good news?

February 9th: We'll consider "kingdom parables" including Jesus parable where he dramatizes the kingdom of God as a banquet and we will also discover (or rediscover) who we should regard as greatest in the kingdom of God.

March 9th: Eternal Life Expression in the Gospel of John is called the "kingdom of God." We'll find out this isn't referring to a long life but rather it's referring to a life that is eternally deep and endless in value and meaning and marked by love and purpose.

April 13th: We'll discuss life forever with God and experiencing the kingdom of God in the here and now as well as in the future life.

Gather Studies are Bible studies published by the Women of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America in their magazine called "Gather". Each issue of the magazine contains a Bible Study and stories of hope and comfort from voices throughout the ELCA to help guide women as they live and experience faith in their everyday lives. 

A Message from our ELCA Global Missionary



Russian Correspondent

General Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Russia "Heal me, Lord, and I will be healed." - these words from Jeremiah 17 were the theme of the 5th General Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Russia (ELCR), held October 15-16 on the premises of the Theological Seminary in the Cathedral of Sts. Peter and Paul in St. Petersburg (photo left).

This biennial meeting of the western and eastern parts of the Russian church focused on church administration and representation, theological education, confessional identity, public relations, and other common issues of ministry.

Among the items of on the agenda was my presentation of the results of three years of committee work on a new, comprehensive liturgical resource that includes settings for Sunday worship, special holy day worship services, occasional services, commentary, and everything related to the lectionary. All in all, almost 500 pages of materials have been prepared for a "test run" on congregations throughout the country.

At present the materials have been distributed as non-bound hard copies which can be placed into folders (also provided) for use during worship; the resource is also available in electronic format for those who would prefer to print on their own or use a projector. This trial version of the liturgical resource was given to synod delegates so that they might further distribute it and test it out in the "real life" conditions of their congregations. Evaluation forms are to be filled out by the middle of 2022, and the comments and requests made by congregational leaders will be considered for further editing and improvement. If all goes according to plan, the final version will be

ready for approval at the next General Synod, followed by publication in book format.

The meeting in St. Petersburg also touched upon one other area related to educational ministries in the ELCR. Rev. Dr. Anton Tikhomirov spoke about the current work of the Theological Seminary, formerly located outside of St. Petersburg in Novosaratovka. Much has changed recently, e.g., the Seminary's move into the city and on-line meetings become more difficult. (Recently, we have had to deal with a new wave of in-person seminar cancellations in St. Petersburg and Ufa because of another deadly wave of COVID.) However, the involuntary situation of the seminary over the past few years – working almost exclusively online – has prepared the institution to adapt to the new reality relatively painlessly. Currently, 42 students from Russian-




Pastor Viktor Weber (TS '12) was installed as the new area dean of central Russia using the new order of installation the service book.

speaking churches from around the former Soviet Union are taking part in the extension education program. In addition, new options for educational events and areas of cooperation are being explored now that the seminary is conveniently located in the city.

CLIMATE CHANGE/GLOBAL WARMING: AN UNCERTAIN FUTURE FOR MINNESOTA

The state of Minnesota has fallen behind in its promise to cut the greenhouse gas emissions that are warming the planet, and the results of that are becoming painfully clear when it comes to our lakes and rivers. Consider the following:

- Climatologists have analyzed up to 100 years of ice and water temperatures on some lakes and rivers across the state, and have found that lakes have lost an average of two weeks of ice coverage over the last 50 years as temperatures have risen. Northern lakes have been hit the hardest, with water temperatures increasing about 4 degrees since 1967.
- The loss of ice affects aquatic life by causing **algae blooms** that deplete oxygen and make it impossible for some species to survive. Toxic algae blooms are a key reason why **walleye**, **cisco**, **lake trout and other cold water-loving fish** have struggled to keep territory that increasingly is inhabited by species such as bass.
- Loss of ice and snow levels will increasingly affect the state's recreation by cramming winter hiking, cross-country skiing, snowmobiling and ice skating into a shorter season.
- The American Geophysical Union has found that as carbon dioxide levels rise, winter storms and tornadoes will have nine times more power by the end of the century due to unstable stormy weather and increased wind shear. Minnesota just recorded the first-time-ever highest temperatures, highest dewpoints and highest winds (fifteen tornadoes) in mid-December.
- The Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA) and DNR report that Minnesota has not only failed to cut carbon emissions to **less than 40 million tons by 2050**, the state has actually increased emissions, which will hasten and amplify the negative effects of climate change/global warming.

Solutions proposed include: 1) protect and restore peatlands, forests and prairies that can store vast amounts of carbon and keep it out of the air (which affects water); 2) build up infrastructure for electric vehicles and commit to more clean energy production.

These developments give us much to think about in regard to our concerns for caring for our Earth.
